



Deadweight Cattle Trade

Mid-week base quotes for in-spec U-3 grade prime cattle continued to decline coming back to 446-454p/kg. Whilst prime cattle quotes from the major processors have eased in recent weeks they remain close to 30p ahead of quotes at this time last year. At the start of the week quotes for good quality 0+3 grade cows ranged from 340-360p/kg. The cow trade also came back mid-week and quotes ended this week ranging from 340-355p/kg. Quotes of 334-350p/kg are expected early next week.

The downward movement in base quotes published by LMC continues to reflect the trade with the average price paid for a steer in NI last week at 461.1p/kg, back 2.1p/kg from the previous week. This is a decline of 12.4p/kg over the last four week period, equating to a decrease of £43.40 in the value of a 350kg carcase. Comparatively in GB the average price for a steer last week was 470.3p/kg, back 14.5p/kg over the four week period, equating to a decline of £50.75 on the value of a 350kg carcase. Similar declines have been recorded across the majority of categories and regions of GB in recent weeks with greater declines reported in ROI.

Prime cattle throughput in NI plants last week totalled 5,815 head, while cow throughput remained strong despite the July holiday with 1,793 head processed. Beef producers are presenting cattle for slaughter at lighter weights with an average carcase weight of 353.8kg and 313.1kg reported in NI plants last week for steers and heifers respectively. This is behind the 356.6kg and 319.2kg reported during Q2 for steers and heifers.

Sheep Trade

At the beginning of the week base quotes for R3 grade lambs ranged from 560-570p/kg across the major NI plants with quotes softening mid-week to 550-560p/kg. Lamb throughput in NI last week totalled 5,835 head with a further 3,092 lambs exported to ROI for direct slaughter last week. The deadweight trade for lambs in NI last week was 579.7p/kg up 2.8p/kg on the previous week, with a strengthening in trade also reported in both GB and ROI. In GB the average price paid was 631p/kg, up 13.9p/kg from the previous week with an increase the equivalent of 4.4p/kg reported in ROI bringing it to 607.7p/kg.

Hogget/Lamb Classification Overview Quarter 2.

Analysis of the NI lamb kill for the period April - June 2023 shows the good quality of lambs processed in NI plants. The average carcase weight during Q2 was 21.5kg compared to 22.2kg reported during the same period of 2022. During Q2 93 per cent of lambs killed locally were in-spec for confirmation, 48 per cent were R grades with 45 per cent U grades. This is a shift from last year when 94 per cent of lambs were in-spec, with 44 per cent categorised as R grades and 50 per cent were U's. Fat scores achieved by lambs during Q2 this year was steady on last year with 89 per cent of lambs in spec for fat cover (scoring 2 or 3).
