

### **Deadweight Cattle Trade**

Base quotes for in spec U-3 prime cattle ended last week in the region of 442-452p/kg, with base quotes for in spec 0+3 cows unchanged from the week previous, ranging from 330-345p/kg. LMC received preliminary base quotes from four of the major processors for early next week which are improved on this week.

Last week prime cattle throughput in NI totalled 6,275 head, a decline of 252 head from the previous week. Meanwhile, last week cattle imports for direct slaughter recorded a decrease of 407 head from the previous week to total 621 head. Cow throughput in NI plants last week also declined from the previous week to total 2,024 head. This was also 73 head behind the average weekly cow kill in NI during the year to date. Overall beef production in NI last week totalled 2,770 tonnes, back by 184 tonnes from the previous week.

Last week in NI all types of cattle recorded increased prices. The average price paid for steers recorded a 4.6p/kg increase on the previous week bringing it to 451.5p/kg. The average price paid for heifers was up by 3.3p/kg to 452p/kg, while the average price paid for young bulls was 438.2p/kg, an increase of 3.7p/kg on the previous week. The cow trade in NI also recorded a welcomed strengthening on the previous week, with the average price paid rising to 307.2p/kg. This was up on average by 11.1p/kg across the grades. The average price paid for an O3 grading cow in NI last week was 346.1p/kg with 307.1p/kg paid on average for a P2 grading cow. Both grades recorded a respective 6.1p/kg increase week on week.

In GB last week the deadweight cattle trade also continued to strengthen attributable to tightening cattle supplies. The average price paid for steers in GB last week was up 3.1p/kg, with improvements of 3-4p/kg also reported for heifers, young bulls and cows. Meanwhile in ROI last week all categories and grades of cattle reported increases from the previous week in both euro and sterling terms.

Last week an average deadweight price of 517.6p/kg was paid for lambs in NI, back slightly from the previous week. Base quotes for R3 grade lambs early next week are expected to remain in the region of 510-515p/kg with the major NI plants paying up to 21kg. Producers are reminded base quotes should be used as a starting point for negotations when selling their stock.

## Liveweight Sheep Trade

The trade across the marts this week eased back on last week with the number of lambs passing through the sale rings increasing. In Swatragh last Saturday 1,400 lambs sold from 437-466p/kg compared to 2,050 lambs the previous week selling from 450-510p/kg. In Kilrea on Monday 950 lambs sold from 470-503p/kg compared to 730 lambs last week selling from 467-578p/kg. In Saintfield this week 740 lambs sold from 465-505p/kg. compared to 790 lambs last week selling from 465-505p/kg. On Wednesday in Ballymena a good entry of 2,302 lambs sold from 445-521p/kg (avg 466p/kg) compared to 1,790 lambs last week selling from 440-500p/kg (avg 468p/kg). Top prices for cull ewes ranged from £165-196 across the marts.
