Statutory veterinary and meat inspection services within NI slaughter sites are expected to be affected by the planned civil service strikes next week, Monday 30th October - Friday 3rd November. At the point of publishing NI meat processors will not be slaughtering livestock during this period, and therefore no base quotes are available for early next week. If you had planned to slaughter please keep in touch with your processor(s). Live animal imports/exports to NI will also be impacted. LMC will strive to keep stakeholders updated on this situation. Deadweight Cattle Trade

Base quotes from the major NI processing plants ended this week ranging from 440-450p/kg for in spec U-3 grade prime cattle.

Strong levels of cattle passed through the NI plants last week as processors implement production plans to account for a missed or reduced throughput next week. Last week prime cattle thoughput totalled 7,729 head. This was an increase of 386 head from the 7,343 head processed during the previous week, while cow throughput in NI last week also increased from the previous week to total 2,824 head. Last week direct slaughter imports from ROI totalled 438 prime cattle, an increase of 200 head from the week prior. A further 177 cows were imported, a similar level to the previous week. Exports from NI to ROI consisted of 33 cows and one heifer, with no cattle moved between NI and GB for direct slaughter last week.

The deadweight trade for cattle in NI softened overall last week, while by category steers remained relatively steady. The average steer price remained steady on the previous week at 454.8p/kg while the R3 steer price was up by 0.2p/kg to 465.5p/kg. Meanwhile the average heifer price was back 1.9p/kg to 454.2p/kg with the R3 heifer price back 1.8p/kg to 464.3p/kg. Moreover, last week the trade for young bulls was back 4.1p/kg on average to 437.1p/kg. The cow trade in NI continued to record declines last week with the average cow price falling 14p/kg to 289.7p/kg while the average 03 and P3 cow price reported a decline of 8.1p/kg and 11.8p/kg to 331p/kg and 308.3p/kg respectively.

Deadweight Sheep Trade

Base quotes from the NI processing plants for R3 grade lambs strengthened as the week progressed and ended this week in the region of 525p/kg up to 21kg. Lamb throughout locally remained strong last week totalling 11,116 head while the average carcase weight increased to 21.4kg, up 0.2kg from the previous week. Lamb exports to R0I last week for direct slaughter were back by 1,381 head from the previous week to total 5,548 head. Meanwhile, last week in NI marts a strong demand from both local and southern buyers saw an average liveweight price of 482.9p/kg paid, up 7.5p/kg from the previous week. The average deadweight lamb price in NI was back by 5.3p/kg to 513.3p/kg last week. In R0I last week an average deadweight lamb price of 541.1p/kg was recorded up 8.6p/kg from the previous week.

Liveweight Sheep Trade

Larger numbers of lambs passed through the NI marts last week with an improved trade also reported. Levels of cull ewes passing through the marts have declined with the trade remaining relatively steady. Last week top reported prices for fat ewes ranged from £123 - £220.
